

Dear CTK family,

So much is going on this week . . . the announcement of the closing of two grade schools that partner with us on different levels, Little Flower and St Roch; the announcement of the impending closure and sale of Fontbonne University, our metropolitan community celebrating STL 314 Day yesterday, St Patrick's Day on Sunday, and St Joseph's Day on Tuesday, the 19th. This Sunday we will have the formal introduction, prayer, and blessing of our Catechumens, Antajuan and Travis, and our Candidates, Chris, Julia, Mary and Samrat.

CTK Grade School is presently in the process of accepting applications for next school year; it looks like it's going to be a very full school. We hope to make room for all who apply, particularly CTK and St Roch parishioner children, along with others who wish to be considered.

I have been a member of **the Board of Trustees at Fontbonne** for the past 8 years. This has been an agonizing time as the institution and the Sisters of St Joseph of Carondelet have considered so many avenues to remain alive but the curse of increasing debt and diminishing enrollment have brought the university to this terminal point after more than 100 years of Catholic higher education. Fontbonne is working to assist the current students to have a positive finish and as smooth a transition as possible to wherever they may be headed. Washington University has agreed to purchase the campus and work with Fontbonne in the transition process and for that we are most appreciative.

Poor St Joseph . . . he seems to always play second fiddle to **St Patrick.** He does not have a recorded word in the Gospels and as if his role in the Holy Family dynamic is not enough, he barely gets attention in the afterglow of the Paddy's Day festivities. So, while you celebrate the patron saint of Ireland be sure to offer up a prayer of thanksgiving to St Joseph for his selfless and heroic response to protecting and providing for Mary and Jesus. **May we all learn the lessons of faith that Patrick's evangelizing and Joseph's love and protection offer to so many throughout the ages. St Patrick, St Joseph, PRAY FOR US.**

Speaking of prayer, hold up our **RCIA participants** as they enter the home stretch of their faith journey to the sacraments and our faith community. Their bios are on the back wall and are quite diverse and inspiring: a doctor, a lawyer, a high school student, a medical salesperson, a stockbroker and a police officer – that's us, the Catholic Church!

> STATIONS OF THE CROSS


